Who We Are

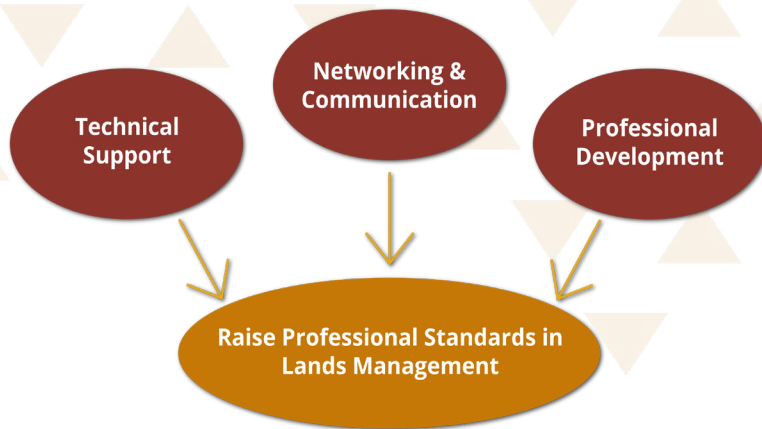

Regional Lands Associations

NALMA membership is made up of the Regional Lands Association and such other eligible persons or Associations as admitted by resolution of the Board.
